An Easter Reflection from Pastor Mark

It was now about noon, and darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon, while the sun's light failed; and the curtain of the temple was torn in two. Then Jesus, crying with a loud voice, said, "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit." Having said this, he breathed his last. When the centurion saw what had taken place, he praised God and said, "Certainly this man was innocent." And when all the crowds who had gathered there for this spectacle saw what had taken place, they returned home, beating their breasts. But all his acquaintances, including the women who had followed him from Galilee, stood at a distance, watching these things. When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. They had been saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?" When they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had already been rolled back. As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man, dressed in a white robe, sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here."

Easter falls on March 31st and we begin the month of April fully embracing the Season of Easter and resurrection. All of you should have received April's Messenger by the start of Holy Week. This reflection is a bridge between Holy Week and Easter Sunday/the month of April.

We live in a society that abhors death. Advertisements try to sell us products that will make us appear more youthful, give us the energy of our youth, and allow us to have fleshly pleasures of our youth. They try to sell us glory, and we are only too eager to grab hold of whatever might give us pep, energy, a spring in our step, and decrease a wrinkle or two. Technology has opened up Pandora's box offering up a whole plethora of drugs and treatments that prolong life, erase years, and put spare body parts in us like we were '54 Buicks. Is it any wonder that people shy away from Good Friday and the cross of Jesus, not to mention the death he calls us to experience in order to be his follower?

Over the years the church has accommodated society's shifting values toward youth and the avoidance of death. One of the biggest changes is Good Friday worship. At one time employers gave this day off – it was a holiday for workers. Everyone would attend noon or evening worship and observe with reverence and gratitude the day when Jesus gave his life for ours – the day he paid God the debt we owed. The church, not wanting to appear old fashioned and keep step with the changing culture then changed Palm Sunday to add the Passion of our Lord. When this happened, people stopped coming to Good Friday services, after all they heard the passion narrative on Palm Sunday. Over time that meant that people also stopped coming to Maundy Thursday service, and then stopped having Easter Vigils on Saturday. These changes have resulted in a disconnection between Holy Week and Easter. There is no way that we can celebrate new life in the resurrection of our Lord when we haven't gone to Calvary, and reading the Passion on Palm Sunday is not the same as going to the place of the skulls. Our faith is not going to mature, grow stronger or deepen when we miss these days in Jesus' life; and truthfully, we have not truly experienced a full-bodied Lent until we died with Jesus on the cross, we have watched and waited, and then are reborn like a butterfly out of a cocoon on Easter Sunday.

My hope is this year you will venture out and come to worship with Jesus and his disciples. Come and join them at the table of the upper room. Come and feel Jesus' hands and the cool water on your feet. Come and hear your voice shout crucify him. Come and watch your Savior bleed from the cruelty of the soldiers. Come and stand beneath Jesus' cross with John, the beloved disciple and Jesus' mother, Mary. Come to continue your journey with our Lord participating in his struggle as he seeks to do the will of God. Come and join him in his suffering for you. Because when we do, the sweet smell of the lilies of his resurrection of Easter Sunday will be all the more meaningful to us. After all you can't have new life without death!



On April 7th, at both the 8 AM and 10:30 AM worship services we will have a service that is known as "Holy Humor Sunday." You may ask, "What is Holy Humor Sunday?" "Bright Sunday" the Sunday following Easter - is an ancient tradition, started by the Greeks in the early centuries of Christianity. Continuing the celebration of Jesus' resurrection, the faithful held parties and picnics and played practical jokes on their pastors. They danced and sang and told jokes. The custom was rooted in the musings of early church theologians (like Augustine, Gregory of Nyssa, and John Chrysostom) that God played a practical joke on the devil by raising Jesus from the dead. "Risus paschalis – the Easter laugh," the theologians called it. Today, that custom is being revived in American churches of many different denominations with what is referred to as "Holy Humor Sunday," offering opportunity for congregations to join in the frivolity of Christ crucified and risen.
