From Pastor Mark.....

It's almost the middle of July and I was visiting one of our parishioners this past week. When I arrived at their residence, the television was turned on and tuned to the Hallmark channel with its *Christmas in July* movies playing. I chuckled to myself when I realized that Christmas was now less than six months away which means Advent isn't far behind.

As we turn our calendar pages to August, we enter a month of anticipation. Anticipation of those last days of summer vacation. Anticipation of our graduates heading off to college and our nests being a little emptier. Anticipation of our children who are still in school of a new academic year with all the preparation of buying new clothes and school supplies. Anticipation of our children who are beginning that journey of kindergarten and first grade, some of our children will enter middle school and even high school. There is the anticipation of a new year of faith formation at St. David's. Anticipation of a new year of Overtime ministry at St. David's. The kicker is we live our lives going from one life-event to the next. The question we are always asking is: *What's up next?* Perhaps we need a reorientation.

Anticipation and hope go hand-in-hand. Anticipation is a forward-looking activity and hope is joined to anticipation because of the anticipated outcome at the conclusion. August reminds us that the Season of Advent is only four months away. August, like the month of December, is a time when we get wrapped up in the busy-ness of preparation and anticipation of back-to-school, or back-to-whatever is the flavor of the busy-ness in our lives.

If anticipation and hope go hand-in-hand, preparation also goes hand-in-hand with anticipation. My invitation this August is that we take time to step back and ponder what kind of kingdom of heaven preparations are we making. What kind of kingdom we anticipate will determine what preparations we are making.

Congregational Input Needed

Columbaria

Dave Barabas proposed to council the idea of building a columbarium in the grove by the garage. There are not many areas where cremated remains can be interred in our area and coupled with the fact that St. David's did not have a cemetery, Dave felt that building a columbarium would be beneficial for our church and community. Council has been discussing this idea, and a subcommittee was formed to begin looking into the creation of this final resting place for urns and cremated remains.

One company consulted for more information is Eickhof, an American company, who provides this information about columbaria: "A columbarium is an above-ground dignified structure containing cremains or ashes in urns. Columbaria (plural) have been used since ancient times to provide an elegant final resting place for the cremation remains of loved ones.

Today, cremation far outpaces traditional burial as the preferred final disposition option. The costs and considerations associated with conventional funerals greatly surpass those associated with cremation and inurnment into a permanent resting place, such as a columbarium.

Sadly, in many locations where dignified columbaria are not present loved ones face the peril of deciding whether to bury cremated remains in a cemetery plot (or atop the grave of a parent or ancestor) or hold on to them until a better decision is reached. Often, this decision is delayed, unfortunately leading to the urn being shelved in a closet or forgotten."

Dave shared with council that many families simply don't know what to do with urns and cremation remains, and thus many of them are stored improperly and dishonorably.

The idea is to begin with one columbarium, approximately 100 spaces, and then add additional columbaria, benches, and gardening as the space grows. There are many different options for designs; however, before the council and the subcommittee proceed any further, input from the congregation is needed. Cathy Lilly has several books and information from the companies we are considering.



Kaufman Cemetery

Dennis Williamson has approached St. David's council about taking over the Kaufman Cemetery, located just up the road from the church. Several church members and other Lutherans are buried in the non-denominational cemetery which has been managed by the Williamson family for years. As the family ages, and younger generations have moved away or have no interest, Dennis is looking for a group or organization to own and maintain the property.

Currently, it is estimated that there are 100 remaining lots to be used in the cemetery, with about half of those already sold. Dennis said that funerals are typically held about four times per year, and they try to avoid burials when the ground is frozen. Ground maintenance would also be an issue; currently, the property is mowed approximately 10 times a year at a cost of \$250/mowing.

Right now, the Kaufman Cemetery bank account has \$60,000 in it, which would cover maintenance and care for several years. However, should St. David's claim the cemetery, we would need to add the property to our insurance, and perpetual care would be needed regardless of income. Cemeteries do not pay taxes in Pennsylvania.

St. David's Council would like to open the floor for comments, questions, and suggestions after services on August 24 and 31 and then hold a congregational vote after the service on Rally Sunday (September 7) to determine the church's wishes for how to proceed with the columbaria and Kaufman Cemetery. Please prayerfully consider what is best for our church and our community and help us to make choices regarding these matters.

Council Meeting Minutes June 26, 2025

Call to Order / Biblical Reflection and Prayer

- Meeting was called to order @ 6:32 PM.
- Prayer was led by Pastor Fischer.

Approval of Minutes / May 28, 2025 meeting

 Approval of minutes via e-mail occurred on June 9, 2025.

Role / Excuse Absences

- Present members: Lauren Bungard, Kristie Byer, Pastor Fischer, Cathy Lilly, Greg Lilly, Mary Jane McCready, and Rachel Thomas-Kimmel, and Jack Winters.
- Absent members: Jeff Eash, Lynn McDaniel, Angie McKool, and Patty Rullo.

Agenda

- Motion to approve the agenda, with addition of guest Dennis Williamson, was made by Lauren Bungard and seconded by Rachel Thomas-Kimmel.
- All in favor, none opposed, none abstained, motion passed.

Guest

Dennis Williamson: He is the manager of the Kaufman Cemetery Association with his brother, Lee. They are getting older, their sons/daughters are either not in the area or not interested, and they think St. David's would be a good fit and would like to pass the responsibility of the cemetery to the church. The cemetery is mostly full; there are 2 or 3 burials per year. They allow two cremations per lot; the lots are \$400 each and there are 100 unfilled lots; 50 have been sold and 50 are available. They have almost \$60,000 in the bank, \$5,000-\$8,000 in checking and the rest in CDs. The Kaufman Cemetery Association currently owns the land and the cemetery is well-kept. Gerald Peterson from Stoystown, PA handles the maintenance, which costs \$250 each time and is usually done 10 times per year. Mike Samone handles snow removal, and any tree removal needed. With the cost of maintenance, they lose money versus the amount of income received; they lose about

\$1,000 per year. The families would bear the cost of opening and closing the grave, which is a fee of \$400 collected at the funeral service. The families are also responsible for the upkeep of the headstones. They have not received any inquiries from government entities (federal, state, or local) and Dennis was unsure of the legal process if St. David's would decide to take ownership of the cemetery. They do not have an official tax exemption, but they have not been paying taxes for the cemetery. They do not have insurance on the cemetery.

Reports

- Pastor's report: Was given by Pastor Fischer.
 - Polka Fest/VBS: Pastor Fischer thanked all who worked to make the Polka Fest and Vacation Bible School run smoothly and with great benefit to all who came.
 - Vacation in August: Next week of vacation will be in August, will schedule it around their granddaughter's 1st birthday and her dedication.
 - Marna hand problem: Pastor Fischer's wife, Marna saw an orthopedic hand specialist and will most likely require surgery to fix, in late July/early August. Pastor Fischer will be out 1-2 days.
 - Pastor Fischer was appreciative of the support for Bishop Emeritus Pile's 50th anniversary ordination celebration.
 - Challenges calling a Pastor: The biggest challenge facing churches in the United States and elsewhere is a shortage of people who are called to the Ministry of Word and Sacrament. Many congregations go years before they call a Pastor. Pastors are retiring in large numbers and fewer people are going to seminary. More and more synods and congregations are relying on layworship assistants to provide worship and preaching leadership to congregations. Pastor Fischer will be writing on this topic in the August and September Messengers and is asking the council to prayerfully think of people at St. David's who would be

- good candidates for the lay-worship ministry program.
- Financial Report: Was given by Brian Byer
 - Summer offering is typically low, recommended announcements to congregation to setup recurring online giving and providing instructions.
 - The next finance meeting is scheduled for July 16, 2025.
- Ministry team coverage: Lynn McDaniel needs added as a Council member on the Fellowship Team; she is also on the alter committee. Jack Winters needs added as a Council member on the Emergency Team.
- Vacation Bible School: Cathy Lilly stated VBS was a great success. There were a lot of kids from throughout the area. She will draft a letter to send to attendees from outside St. David's, inviting them to St. David's if they do not have a church. There will be a Sunday School meeting on July 11, 2025.
- God's Work Our Hands (GWOH) Greg Lilly mentioned they are planning for several GWOH projects including a fundraiser for Lutheran World Relief, members needing assistance with home chores, kits for students and teachers at school, and meals on wheels dessert collection. They have decided the sandbox update would be too much to complete in one day. The quilting group is looking for 3" c clamps and also a history of when St. David's began making quilts.
- Emergency Team: Was given by Jack
 Winters. Deb Harris is working on setting up a team meeting.

Unfinished Business:

- Columbarium: The Team had a short meeting before the Council meeting. Discussed two companies:
 - Sunset Memorial & Stone from Canada.
 Sunset did not like our grounds or the power lines and have been persistent even though we are in early discussions.

- Eickhof Columbaria Inc. from Minnesota. They provided brochures and their products are manufactured in Minnesota. Traditional urns or ossuariums (urn bags) can both be used.
- The next step is to determine if there is interest in the congregation.
 Announcement will be put in the August Messenger, along with a meeting after church to vote. God's Work Our Hands (GWOH) Sunday was recommended for the voting. Rachel Thomas-Kimmel will draft letters/announcements with the columbarium and cemetery information.
- Fellowship Hall: Meeting needs scheduled to review at a later date.

New Business:

- New Council Member: Jack Winters is serving in honor of Dave Barabas.
- Request from Quilters group: Katie Jones asked Cathy Lilly if their quilters group could have retreats in the St. David's Fellowship Hall. There are around 30 members in the group and they have retreats three times per year, for three days in a row, and from 7:00 AM-830 PM each day. Cathy Lilly cleared it with the Learning Place, but we need some additional information. Do they need access to the kitchen and what dates are they planning, to ensure they do not conflict with activities already scheduled. Also need to determine what St. David's is charging for the Fellowship Hall as part of the updates needed to the Fellowship Hall agreement. Council will then vote through email.

Next meeting will be July 31, 2025 at 6:30 PM.

Meeting adjourned at 7:50 PM. Meeting was adjourned with the Lord's prayer.
