The family or person may not want a visit but a phone call letting them know they are being held in prayer is spiritual food for the soul.

St. David's is a large congregation. My church directory runs 27 pages long. Compared to other Lutheran congregations in the Johnstown area, this is a large congregation. It may not seem that way to you when you look back fondly on the 70's, 80', 90's and early 2000's. In those years, St. David's was overflowing with families and children and there were multiple called pastors serving here. I don't know and I can't know everyone's story

; I would love to know the stories. If you call and let me know that Mrs. Claus is ill, I won't tell her who told me. I will extend the love of Christ and offer any pastoral care to her and to the family that they need.
