## ***FROM THE PASTOR.....***

The decorations are done and put away for another year. The Christmas trees are out at the curb awaiting pick-up to become mulch for our flowerbeds. Christmas is over and we have gone from infant Jesus in the manger to an adult Jesus being baptized. For three Sundays in January and two Sundays in February, we will be in the Season of Epiphany. It is in the season of Epiphany, we have the beginning of Jesus' ministry and concluding with his transfiguration before Peter, James and John.

One of the first things Jesus does is to call his first entourage of disciples, Peter, Andrew, James, and John, all fishermen. Definitely not your seminary-educated group of people. These men are not the educated elites of society; they are men who used to hard, back-breaking work of casting and hauling nets, working long hours, and living life on the edge because their earnings are dependent upon the size of their catch. **BUT**, they dropped everything, left everything they knew to be Jesus' first disciples.

The ELCA and many faith traditions are at a cross-roads: How does the Church today raise up spiritual leaders to proclaim the Gospel Good News of Jesus Christ? The challenges of raising up people who will lead our congregations have as many sides as a stop-sign.

The last Gospel of passage for January was Jesus calling his first disciples, Peter, Andrew, James, John. Often, this Sunday is considered vocation Sunday in the Catholic Church where single men are encouraged to consider entering seminary to become priests.

Luther talked about the *Priesthood of all believers* where we are all joined to the priesthood of Christ by our baptisms. And vocation is not strictly tied to whether or not one becomes an ordained pastor. Luther understood vocation as that which where we use our God-given talents and gifts to best serve God and community in our employed work. Luther also believed that all work was valued by God whether one was a ditchdigger, a tradesman like a printer, a prince, or a priest.

The Church, Lutheran, Catholic, Methodist, Presbyterian, etc. is in dire need of men and women who sense and hear God calling them to the Ministry of Word and Sacrament. Many are put off by the idea of relocating their families to attend seminary. Many cannot afford to spend the sums of money or take on student loans to finance the cost of a seminary education (Tuition for a full-time seminary student is around \$18,000/year). How does one afford to do this when there is a significant loss of income to pay the everyday bills? And then there is the length of time spent obtaining a Master's of Divinity degree, three years of in-class education and a 12-month internship. Many candidates for ordination cannot easily move to another geographical region of the United States to take a call for a list of reasons as long as an arm and a leg. No longer can people be like Peter and his companions who up and left family and work to follow Jesus. Lastly, there is the cost to a congregation of calling a full-time pastor; costs like salary & housing allowance, medical insurance if the spouse does not have coverage through work, pension, and other miscellaneous expenses.

Yet the need is still there. Congregations want, need, and deserve to hear God's Word preached, the Sacraments administered, pastoral care given, and the faithful nurtured in their faith formation. The ELCA has created a program called T.E.E.M. (Theological Education for Emerging Ministries); many people who are enrolled in candidacy are using this process today. It allows a person to be in the process of becoming a Minister of Word and Sacrament without the cost of moving and continue to stay employed at their current work. A person enters into the candidacy process with their synod, completes a series of thirteen seminary classes consisting of one-week intensive sessions and assignments, serves as a worship leader in a congregation with a small stipend, and completes an internship. Some classes are in-person, and some are online ZOOM classes. When the thirteen classes are successfully completed, the person receives a Certificate of Theological Education. Successful completion of the internship and candidacy allows the person to be called and ordained. This is a bare-bones and simplified explanation of the T.E.E.M. program and I may be missing some parts to it. The Allegheny Synod and United Lutheran Seminary offer financial support for people enrolled in the T.E.E.M. program.

Perhaps you are one who has heard God calling you to be and do more than sit in a pew on a Sunday morning. Perhaps you are one who has heard God calling you to this Ministry of Word and Sacrament but couldn't see a path forward because of your current life situation. If you are this person, I am willing to sit with you in conversation, prayer, and discernment. Please feel free to reach out to me.

Council Meeting Minutes

January 8, 2026

**Call to Order / Biblical Reflection and Prayer**

- Meeting was called to order @ 6:32 PM.
- Prayer was led by Pastor Fischer.

**Approval of Minutes / November 20, 2025 meeting**

- Approval of minutes via e-mail occurred on December 2, 2025.

**Attendees / Excused Absences**

- Present members: Lauren Bungard, Jeff Eash, Pastor Fischer, Cathy Lilly, Greg Lilly, Lynn McDaniel, Angie McKool, Sue Risch, Patty Rullo, Doug Shrader, Lois Tessari, Rachel Thomas-Kimmel, Paul Weygandt, and Jack Winters.
- Absent members: Sonya Andrews and Kristie Byer

**Agenda**

- Motion to approve the agenda, was made by Rachel Thomas-Kimmel and seconded by Greg Lilly.
- All in favor, none opposed, none abstained, motion passed.

**Guests**

- Deb Harris: Discussed concerns about the door attendant fee being eliminated. She checked with other churches around the area and they are still locking doors during services. A lot of time was spent by the Emergency Team on setting things up to make the church safer. Cement posts could be installed if a car driving through is a concern or some other deterrent. Doors to the sanctuary can also be barricaded. Council will discuss, but has previously voted on this item.
- Brad Kaufman: Discussed issues with the heated sidewalks in front of the main entrance. They are not heating up to melt the ice. The pilot light was out, which was replaced last year and the heated sidewalks were only used one time after. Marc's Service looked at it and believe the control panel is the issue, but recommended replacing everything due to the age. The water heater could need replaced soon; it is 12 years old. The glycol looks like river water. The bid was approximately \$2500, but may be higher due to unknowns such as how much glycol will be needed. Not sure yet when the work would be completed.

**Reports**

- Pastor's report: Was provided by Pastor Fischer.
  - Pastor Fischer provided staff evaluations. Council members are to review and discuss further at the next Council meeting.
  - Vacation: Pastor Fischer will be on vacation March 19-24, 2026 and June 28-July 12, 2026. He will arrange pastoral care and supply pastors.
  - Supply Pastor Fee: Allegheny Synod has made it known that congregations are not to be paying more than the designated amount for supply pastors, which is \$140.00 for one service and \$190.00 for two services.
  - Mandated reporter training: Is required every five years. It is available to take online, which would take three hours. Somerset County Children & Youth Services (CYS) does not offer in-person training. Meredith Deal from Centre Safe in State College is willing to come here to do training in February. She is asking for round-trip mileage, which will be about \$130.00. Pastor Fischer will verify that volunteers are required to take the training. If so, we need to discuss with Jessica Brewer to determine how many members need to take the training.
  - Mid-week Lenten services: Will cover *Witness at the Cross* by Amy Jill Levine.
  - Allegheny Synod Installation costs: The Allegheny Synod has reached out to the congregation requesting financial help to cover the expenses of Bishop Shock's installation, including travel costs and to purchase a miter and staff. Doug Shrader stated there is money in the memorial fund that is available.
    - Motion to give \$400 from the memorial fund to the Allegheny Synod, was made by Doug Shrader and seconded by Sue Risch.
    - Twelve in favor, none opposed, one abstained, motion passed.
  - It was discussed to move the monthly Council meeting to earlier in the month. Doug Shrader mentioned that Brian Byer needs time to prepare the financial reports and will also need to consider timing of the Messenger deadline. Will discuss the Messenger timing with Jessica Brewer.
- Financial Report: Was provided by Brian Byer

- Supply Pastor Fee: Brian Byer noted that our supply pastor fee is higher than what the Allegheny Synod is designating. We were paying \$300.00 for two services. Council will table this and discuss at the next Council meeting.
- Financial report: December report was reviewed. It was noted that more was spent on Overtime this year than we had in donations.
- First National Bank (FNB) Credit Card points: St. David's has 72,000 credit card points to purchase items. No update on this, but Brian Byer will provide the login information to someone on Council to look at the available options.
- Check signers: Brian Byer will reach out to signers to verify they are willing to continue signing in 2026.
- Service Team: Sue Risch stated the service team is always looking for new members.

- Sanctuary lights: Lois Tessari discussed the large number of non-working sanctuary lights and repairs may require changing lightbulbs, but could mean replacing fixtures. Also, that Von Parkins has offered to help with the project and an estimate will be obtained first.

Next meeting will be January 29, 2026 at 6:30 PM.

Meeting adjourned at 8:27 PM. Meeting was adjourned with the Lord's prayer.
