From Pastor Mark... A reflection on the 3rd Commandment: Remember the Sabbath Day and keep it holy.

In mid-June, I had a conversation with someone and he asked how my vacation was; my reply was that I had a great Sabbath. Many of you know that I worked at the U.S. Women's Open Golf Tournament the week of May 26th. With the exception of Monday, May 27th, the weather was great, I got to see some great golf, spend time with children & grandchildren, stop and see friends, meet people from all over the United States and other countries who had come either to see the golf tournament or work it like I was doing. We had free housing courtesy of Marna's son, Evan, found out that our third grandchild will be a girl, and we got to worship at a church where I had served as their interim pastor in Lebanon County. It was a good, relaxing, refreshing, and renewing time. I came back to St. David's looking to embrace all the activities of the summer and look forward to the resumption of fall activities. When asked if I had a good vacation, I replied that I had a good sabbath.

All of the events of that week had me thinking about the commandment to keep the Sabbath Day and to make/keep it holy. The Ten Commandments are found in the 20th chapter of Exodus and with the third commandment is a brief retelling of the creation story about God's creative work for six days and resting on the 7th and the command that on the Sabbath day, one including the foreigner is to do no work of any kind on the Sabbath day. BTW, we derive the word, *sabbatical*, a set-aside time from our vocation, from the word, *sabbath*.

As we enter the summer months, many of us take vacations to our favorite places like the shore or to visit family who live a distance from us. Do you treat your time away from your homes, your normal routines, your vocations as a time of Sabbath renewal? I hope you do. The 3rd commandment is to remember the Sabbath Day and keep it holy. In Luther's time, the Roman Catholic Church of the Middle Ages had created a preponderance of "*holy*" days when one was expected to attend mass. Luther, in his writings on the third commandment, held it to be more important for a person to spend sabbath time apart from work and to spend time with God's word rather than having to be seen in at mass.

My wish for all of you is to have a blessed summer, and if you do take time away for vacation, that you have safe travels, and that you find a way to make it a holy time of renewal for your soul as well as your body.

Recap of the 36th Annual Allegheny Synod Assembly

On June 14th-15th, the congregations of the Allegheny Synod gathered for worship on Friday, June 14th and for the business meeting on June 15th at the Blair County Convention Center. A synod assembly is much like the annual meeting of a congregation: a necessary part of the life of being church. Budgets are adopted, people are elected to positions of leadership within the synod, and reports are presented by the various ministries supported by the Allegheny Synod. As your interim pastor, I find synod assemblies to be a place to meet colleagues and other lay people as well as to conduct the business of the synod and also to get new ideas for doing ministry.

We did all that on Saturday. During the morning session, a budget was adopted for the fiscal year beginning February 1, 2025, people were elected to the Allegheny Synod Council and to serve on various committees, a new secretary of the synod was elected with the announced retirement of Dave Finney, people were elected to represent the Allegheny Synod at the ELCA Church Assembly in August 2025, and we heard reports from the various staff people of the synod. In the afternoon, we heard reports from the various supporting ministries of the Allegheny Synod like Camp Sequanota, Penn State Campus Ministry, Lutheran Advocacy in Pennsylvania, the prison ministry at FCI-Loretto, United Lutheran Seminary, and several others.

Some take-aways from the Allegheny Synod Assembly:

➤ Bishop Lebo, A2B Shock, and United Lutheran Seminary representative, Chel Huth talked about the need that synods and in particular, congregations, are going to have to look to home-grow their worship and pastoral care from within. Currently there are over 600

congregational openings with less than 300 pastors looking to take a new call. A significant percentage of these pastors are limited where they can relocate geographically due to spousal employment or the needs of their children, or other commitments. In 2024, a high percentage (90%+) of the less than 200 graduating M.Div. students are returning to their home synods for calls. Since the 2023 synod assembly, The Allegheny Synod had four students complete their Certificate in Theological Studies, one student graduated seminary and they are either ordained or serving their internships. I am most likely one of the last people who went through the assignment process and was assigned here to the Allegheny Synod. As a side note, the Allegheny Synod and St. David's is losing one of the longest tenured lay worship assistants when Dave Finney relocates to West Virginia this fall. His service to the synod as secretary and lay worship assistant will be greatly missed. Thank you for your service, Dave.

- Rev. Rebecca Horn was elected to the position of Allegheny Synod Secretary.
- ➤ This year, Camp Sequanota is employing four camp counselors who are from Perus, Pakistan, Mexico. This is an intentional decision by the camp leadership to broaden the experience of the campers by interacting with people of other cultures.
- Also, Camp Sequanota is also hosting a week of campers who are Muslim, and campers from the Altoona-Johnstown Diocese, and also hosting the PA State Police Cadet Camp.
- ➤ B.E. Pile spoke about a preaching grant initiative titled, "Go Tell It In The Mountains." More on this to come...
