

From the Pastor.....

Lent begins on Wednesday, March 5th with Ash Wednesday and the Church enters into this other-worldly season that is supposed to be different than all the other seasons of the Church year. Some years ago, a pastor told me that Lent was her favorite season of the church year. I didn't quite know what to make of her comment until I had experienced a Season of Lent as a seminary student. Then I got what she meant; one cannot get to the empty tomb without walking with Jesus all the way to the cross and his crucifixion and death. To fully appreciate the Season of Lent, one must immerse oneself into following and walking with Jesus all the way even to the cross. Because you cannot get to the empty tomb otherwise.

There is a more somber, solemn tone to worship and some events or happenings like weddings don't take place during Lent. This is the reason we take out the hymn of praise and we change the Gospel acclimation from "Alleluia, Lord to whom shall we go..." to "Return to the Lord, you God, for He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love."

For Lent this year, I have crafted a sermon series titled "*The Five Senses of Faith.*" Each Sunday, I will explore one of our senses and how we can better understand how the beauty and mystery of God's molding and shaping of humanity.

Lutheranism 101

Last month, I talked about the "*altered*" vs "*unaltered*" versions of the Augsburg Confession. This month, I want to talk about what exactly is the Augsburg Confession.

Background:

- ▶ In 1517, Luther published his 95 Theses which kicked off the Reformation
- ➢ In 1521 at the Diet of Worms, Luther defended his writing and theological positions and was condemned at a heretic. It was at this time Luther went into seclusion and hiding under the protection of Frederick the Wise.
- Charles V, Emperor of the Holy Roman Empire convened a *Diet* or *Council* to be held in Augsburg (Part of modern day Germany) in June,1530. The purpose of this *Diet* was to allow those attending to decide on three issues: 1) What to do about the incursion of the Ottoman Empire into Holy Roman Empire (HRE) territory. 2) Deal with issues of policy and well-being of the HRE. 3) Reach a compromise on the religious and theological issues raised by the German reformers. This is when the Augsburg Confession was presented and read.

The Augsburg Confession was written by Phillip Melanchthon with help from Johanne Brenz and presented in Latin and German on June 25, 1529. The Augsburg Confession contains twenty-one articles on matters of faith and seven articles on remedying abuses of the Roman Catholic Church. In August, 1530, The Roman Catholic presented their reply is what is known as *The Confutation*. A list of these twenty-eight articles is on the bulletin board across from Pastor Mark's office. The Augsburg Confession is the first document after the Apostles', Nicene, and Athanasian Creeds in The Book of Concord. More to follow....Stay tuned.....

Jerrod Cannistraci and Sherri Andrews provided current status on Pastoral Transition Process Summary. St. Davids Site profile has been completed. Waiting to hear from Bishop/Synod with any candidates. Would then be up to Call Committee to interview and observe the candidate, and then decide whether to make a recommendation to Council.

<u>Reports</u>

- Pastor's report: Was given by Cathy Lilly.
 - Pastor will be away at a Continuing Education event February 5-6, 2025 and February 20, 2025.
- Financial report: Was given by Brian Byer.

Brian Byer discussed the endowment fund and the 10% tithe (\$4000) for 2025.

- Motion to raise the endowment fund base for 2025 to \$135,000 was made by Angie McKool and seconded by Greg Lilly. All in favor, none opposed, none abstained, motion passed.
- Second motion to tithe \$4000 to projects within the community was made by Patty Rullo and seconded by Greg Lilly. All in favor, none opposed, none abstained, motion passed. Council will discuss project recommendations at next month's meeting, which will then be voted on by the congregation.

Cathy Lilly discussed computer replacement for Brian and Jessica. Windows 10 is now in end of life and the computers will not support an upgrade to Windows 11. Brian will look into costs to replace and potentially replacing with laptop computers instead of desktop computers.

Cathy Lilly mentioned planning for Vacation Bible School (VBS) has started. The dates are June 16-20, 2025. Friday will again be all day at Camp Sequanota and the other days will be evenings at St. Davids.

Rachel Thomas-Kimmel announced that the Children & Youth will be holding a soup sale on February 9, 2025 after services. If anyone would like to donate soup, contact the Children & Youth Team and drop off donations on Saturday, February 8, 2025 between 9-12.

Unfinished Business:

- Check signers 3 council members still need to verify information and sign paperwork at the bank. Then Brian Byer will provide schedule out to signers.

New Business:

- Summer services –Outdoor services are being discussed for a week in May, July, and August this year.
- Brad discussed outside maintenance with Cathy Lilly and whether we will continue the lawn care/maintenance contract used last year. We will need to reach out to Grose General Services, LLC to determine if they are interested in continuing services and to obtain a new quote. Brad was also concerned about internal tasks that are not completed when he is on vacation. We will look into cleaning agencies that could be hired to cover during these times.

Other Business/Discussions for the good of the church:

Council meeting time was discussed and motion to move time to 6:30 PM going forward was made by Rachel Thomas-Kimmel and was seconded by Kristie Byer. All in favor, none opposed, none abstained, motion passed.
