Thoughts on Mother's Day and Women in the Bible

The trinty in the greeting card industry is: Christmas, Valentine's Day, and Mother's Day. These three holidays are the top greeting card holidays in sales and gifts. Along with Valentine's Day, Mother's Day is one of the busiest days for florists, too. Where did Mother's Day originate?????

From the magazine, *Good Housekeeping*,* I learned some interesting trivia: Mother's Day was started by one woman after the death of her mother. Ann, on May 9, 1905, Anna Jarvis looked for a way to honor her mother and mothers everywhere. She began the movement in West Virginia which prides itself on hosting the first Mother's Day celebration. In 1914, President Woodrow Wilson, having heard about Anna Jarvis' idea for celebrating her mother, issued a proclamation establishing Mother's Day as a national holiday on the 2nd Sunday in May. And as they say, the rest is history.

In the Old and New Testaments, women are found throughout the biblical story. Eve in the beginning of creation, Hagar & Sarah, Rebekah, Leah & Rachel (wives of the Patriarchs), Deborah, Moses' sister, Deliah who got Sampson to cut his hair, plus another twelve women in the book of Judges, Bathsheba, the woman that King David got pregnant, Mary (Jesus' mother), Elizabeth (John the Baptist's mother), Mary & Martha, Mary Magdalene, Salome (one of the women who went to the tomb on Easter morning), Priscilla and Phoebe (Among those mentioned by Paul in his letters). There are a lot of women in the biblical story; this is just a sampling. In a time of patriarchy as the norm and rule of daily life, it is amazing how many women are found in the Bible.

During the month of May as we celebrate Mother's Day; I am going to highlight some of the women who have impacted the life of the church over the centuries with a short piece in the Sunday announcements.

Call to Order / Biblical Reflection and Prayer

- Meeting was called to order @ 6:31 PM.
- Prayer was led by Pastor Fischer.

Agenda

- Cathy Lilly added an item to the Agenda under New Business to discuss Conemaugh Township post prom craft room donation.
- Motion to approve the agenda with the added item was made by Angie McKool and seconded by Mary Jane McCready.
- All in favor, none opposed, none abstained, motion passed.

Reports

- Pastor's report: Was given by Pastor Fischer.
 - Constitution: Synod Secretary found errors with the updated St. Davids Constitution submitted to the Allegheny Synod. With the Synod reviewing their constitution later this year, instead of updating again, we will wait until the Synod updates their constitution and then make St. Davids' recommended updates and present to the Congregation for approval.
 - Pre-assembly caucus: St. Davids is being asked to host the meeting for Johnstown and Laurel Highlands Conferences again this year. Meeting will be held on May 1, 2025 at 7:00 PM. Fellowship Team will provide refreshments for the event.
 - Festival of Homiletics: St. Davids is being asked to host the online location being held May 13-15,
 2025. Would need to provide drinks and TV for the event.
 - Continuing Education: Looking into an event for August 13-15, 2025.
 - Camp Parc Scholarship: Discussed whether St. Davids should contribute to scholarships for St.
 Davids youth attending Camp Parc. Similar to the scholarship for Camp Sequanota, St. Davids will contribute 50% toward the cost of the Camp Parc youth camp fee of \$300.00.
 - Wedding Request: Pastor Fischer was asked to do a wedding for a couple from out of the area. The wedding will take place at Whispering Hollow Estates in Bedford County on October 11, 2025.
- Learning Place report: Was given by Cathy Lilly. Discussed Conemaugh Township art students painting a mural on the Learning Place wall and whether there were concerns with this, there will be a teacher there. Council did not have concerns with this.
- Patty Rullo needs added as a Council Member for the Service Team.
- Dave Barabas needs added as the Council Member for the Emergency Team.
- Fellowship/Witness Team: Dave Barabas said the team is working on plans for the Easter breakfast and the God's Work Our Hands (GWOH) event.

Unfinished Business:

- Wedding planning manual: Pastor Fischer made the updates regarding couples having a volunteer point person that can act as a coordinator/point person for the day of the ceremony.
