Random thoughts.....

I love riding roller coasters {But only on YouTube}. Roller coasters combine fear and excitement all in one big thrill especially if it is the newest, latest, and greatest that pushes the envelope of the ride. There is the anticipatory gut check as you are taken up the initial incline and then the sheer terror as you hang over the drop and then the steep, dive to the ground and you wonder, "Am I going to live through this?"

Perhaps you may have felt that fear and excitement when your children were born; there is no instruction manual to go with your newborn son or daughter. Or when you got a promotion at work that involved supervising other people. Ministry is often like this. I remember the first time I led worship as a supply pastor in seminary. Even though I had successfully passed the required worship and preaching classes, I remember the fear of messing up something during the worship service.

Change is like riding a roller coaster, especially in a church. There is fear and excitement all at the same time. Change is necessary for continued growth in any organization, especially the Church. In the next ten years, the Church and especially churches in Somerset/Cambria Counties will see profound change as our members age and enter God's eternal kingdom. What will St. David's look like in 2035? Will St. David's still have two services? Will St. David's be able to afford to continue supporting a pastor alone? Or will it have to partner with another congregation and share a pastor? What ministries will St. David's be supporting and sustaining?

Jesus talked about salt losing its saltiness and thereby its effectiveness. This week at the Allegheny Synod Pastors' Convocation, we talked about the importance of being creative and thinking outside our "silos." Another way is to say that congregations are looking at remaining salty. Asking tough questions like: Who is our neighbor? and How to be a good neighbor? Responding to change and anticipating change are critical to an organization's viability. I would love to hear what new ideas for ministry you have. Call me. Make an appointment.

Another Not-so-random thought

I want to take a moment and write about where St. David's is financially through August, 2025. August means that we are 2/3 through our calendar year. Through August, our giving totals \$211,699; that is a little over \$4000 ahead of last year; that's a positive. That said, St. David's 2025 giving is \$12,000 less than the budgeted giving and our spending on a number of line items has exceeded what was budgeted. For example, inside building maintenance is \$3,400 over budget, snow removal is \$1,500 over budget, Added all up, our expenses so far exceed our giving by \$29,325 through August. I know many of us are feeling the strain of continued high food prices, high fuel prices, and increased utility costs plus the unexpected like auto repair bills. I'm right there with you.

This is my ask: If you need to bring your giving up-to-date, please help by doing so. If you can find some extra, please add it to your current giving. Thank you.

Stewardship & Finance Teams Note

Summer months are always difficult financially for our church. Due to decreased attendance and donations falling off.

As of August Financials, we are around \$12,000 below our tithing budget. We are around \$10,000 over our budgeted expenses YTD. Some key reasons are: \$3,000 for needed new computers, \$2,800 for air conditioning repairs, \$1,000 for sidewalk heat repairs and snowplowing was \$2,500 over budget. Also \$31,000 was taken out of the Unified Savings Account to cover expenses YTD.

Therefore our bottom line is an estimated shortfall of \$29,000 for the Congregations approved Ministry Spending Plan this year. We ask that the Congregation consider this in their giving for the remainder of the year.

Council Meeting Minutes August 28, 2025

Call to Order / Biblical Reflection and Prayer

- Meeting was called to order @ 6:34 PM.
- Prayer was led by Pastor Fischer.

Approval of Minutes / July 31, 2025 meeting

Approval of minutes via e-mail occurred on August 4, 2025.

Attendees / Excused Absences

- Present members: Lauren Bungard, Pastor Fischer, Cathy Lilly, Greg Lilly, Mary Jane McCready, Lynn McDaniel, Angie McKool, Patty Rullo, and Rachel Thomas-Kimmel.
- Absent members: Kristie Byer, Jeff Eash, and Jack Winters

Agenda

- Cathy Lilly requested an addition to the agenda to add Doug Shrader as a guest.
- Motion to approve the agenda with the addition, was made by Patty Rullo and seconded by Mary Jane McCready.
- All in favor, none opposed, none abstained, motion passed.

Guest

Doug Shrader: Discussed concerns with the congregational vote on St. David's taking ownership of Kaufman Cemetery and building a columbarium on St. David's property. He does not believe the due diligence was done and the congregation is not being fully informed. Council discussed that we are aware there will be legal, financial, and other concerns that would need further researched. The intent of the vote was to determine whether there was interest in building the columbarium and/or taking ownership of the Kaufman Cemetery. Either avenue would be looked into further if there was congregational interest.

Reports

- Pastor's report: Was given by Pastor Fischer.
 - Pastor Fischer was approached about using St. David's as a neutral site for an ordination service. A
 candidate has been called to a two-point parish and the ordination service needs to be held at a
 neutral location. The church parishes are Benscreek Lutheran and First Lutheran Johnstown. There
 will not be a need for the Fellowship Ministry Team or Worship and Music Ministry Team to be
 involved. Pastor Fischer spoke with Brett Merberger and he is okay with the organist from First
 Lutheran playing.
 - Pastor Fischer is looking into putting a trip to Greece and Turkey together for next year. It would be
 a journey of many of the places where Paul planted churches. It would be in September 2026 and
 open to area churches with around 15-20 people.
 - Pastor Fischer will have pastoral care lined up for his vacation in October by the September Council meeting.
 - o Bible time with St. David's Learning Place will start Monday, September 8, 2025.

- New family joining: New members, Brandon, Jackie, and Griffen Stevanus, will be received on September 28, 2025.
- Confirmation class: The confirmation class program is coming together. Students and parents will be asked to sign a covenant detailing the expectations.
- Windber Woods: Residents and staff at Windber Woods are grateful for Pastor Fischer leading worship and offering Holy Communion on the first Sunday of each month. About 30 residents attend the service.
- Increase for non-member weddings: Pastor Fischer recommended increasing the cost for non-member weddings at St. David's to \$500. This fee covers the cost of the use of the church, the custodian, and bulletins. The Council will consider and vote on this at a future council meeting.
- Financial Report: Cathy Lilly will submit a request to the Finance Team requesting an increase to the confirmation budget.
- Learning Place Board: Cathy Lilly stated the board is conducting interviews for an open position.
- God's Work Our Hands: Is scheduled for September 7, 2025.
- Overtime: St. David's Learning Place brought to Council's attention that when they came in on Monday following the August 22, 2025 Overtime, the men's restroom was a mess. It was assumed it was left that way from Overtime. Announcements will be made to address this.
- Communications Team: Lou Ann Reckner and Angie McKool have been working on getting access to the St. David's website. Receiving the access code has been an issue. They will wait another day and try again.

Unfinished Business:

- Columbarium/Cemetery: Bishop Emeritus and Barb Pile presented a survey to Cathy Lilly as a better
 approach to request congregational input on the columbarium and cemetery rather than having the
 vote on September 7, 2025. The recommended survey will be made available to the congregation with
 a request to have them returned by September 21, 2025 ahead of the next council meeting.
- Fellowship hall: Updates to the Fellowship Hall document are still being worked on.
- Request from guilters group: Cathy Lilly has not heard back from Katie Jones with additional details.
- Memorial designation: Brian Byer to get back to Council on this.

New Business:

• Brad Kaufman's elbow surgery: He had the surgery and will be off for 6 weeks. Pastor Fischer will look into the sick leave and vacation available and discuss with him. Council discussed the need to make sure cleaning and upkeep is still happening while he is out. Greg Lilly will make sure God's Work Our Hands is aware and that they will take care of cleaning up and also ordering any needed paper products. Cathy Lilly will also talk to Property and Emergency Teams on their plan for coverage. There could be potential for cleaning the church to be a God's Work Our Hands project, but is likely too late.

Next meeting will be September 25, 2025 at 6:30 PM.

Meeting adjourned at 7:44 PM. Meeting was adjourned with the Lord's prayer.
